

Exhibit A:

In evaluating onsite return-to-work and implementing social distancing policies, employers should pay attention to regulations and guidance issued by the governmental agencies, such as OSHA and the CDC. Contractors will be required to conduct screening of all employees/subcontractors prior to the beginning of any job. If an employee/subcontractor answers yes to any of the below questions, they will not be allowed on the job site.

Screening questions:

- Have you experienced signs or symptoms of a respiratory infection such as: Fever? Cough? Shortness of breath?
- Have you returned from international travel or been on a cruise within the last 14 days?
- Have you been in contact with anyone who has returned from international travel or been on a cruise within the last 14 days?
- Have you had contact with someone who has OR is under investigation for COVID-19?
- Have you been in any gathering of 250 people or more (including airports) in the last 14 days?
- Have you traveled to any of the following states in the last 14 days? California, Washington, New York, Louisiana?

In addition, precautions will consist of:

- Wearing a mask inside of the building.
- Disinfecting areas after job is complete.
- Bathrooms will not be accessible for use by employees or subcontractors.
