

NOTE: The FEMA security desk and entrance gates are rather imposing and divide the entrance to two of our meeting areas (you *do not go through FEMA security* to get to either of these areas):

- To get to Capitol Ballrooms I & II and the Capitol Foyer go left past the security desk and you'll see the Foyer and Ballrooms straight ahead.
- To get to the **House & Senate Rooms** and the **Caucus Boardroom**, go to the right of the desk and hug the right-hand wall (don't try to go through the gates!). These rooms (along with restrooms and vending machines) are down the hallway to the right.
